## ASTA/NJ Cadet Teacher Training Course

## CTTC Course curriculum

The curriculum, which can be adapted for any of the ASTA string instruments, must include the following:

- 1. A minimum of 5 critiqued practice teaching opportunities.
- 2. Selection and care of instruments and basic equipment.
- 3. Student set-up and posture.
- 4. Beginning lessons.
- 5. Detailed study of at least one beginner method.
- 6. Overview of supplemental literature
- 7. How to build basic skills in the right hand.
- 8. How to build basic skills in the left hand.
- 9. How to set up a studio.
- 10. String teacher resources.
- 11. A thumbnail history of the specific instrument pedagogy.
- 12. How to solve common teaching problems.

The methods used by the course instructors may include lecture, hands-on experiences, handouts, homework, research papers, and video presentations.
